This appeal was highly examined with utmost attention and led to the re-consideration of the duration of detention of Mr. Said Ali Said Jadad and his release from detention on 26.08.2016.

The Permanent Mission of the Sultanate of Oman remains at the disposal of the Working Group for any further requests on this matter.
