Mr. Ali Chibshat and Mr. Seyyed Khaled Mousavi were arrested on charge of conducting terrorist acts including destructing oil and gas pipelines through bombing. Their file was considered in a court in city of Ahvaz in Khuzestan province. After hearing the defense of their lawyers, and based on the evidence, they were sentenced to death penalty.

The issued verdict was appealed by the condemned persons and the lawyers. Therefore, the case was referred to the Supreme Court. The Appeal Court reconsidered the case and reaffirmed the verdict.
