The Permanent Mission of the Republic of Moldova to the United Nations Office and other International Organizations in Geneva presents its compliments to the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights, Special Procedure Branch, and has the honour to inform the latter on the evolutions regarding the case of Mr. [REDACTED], reflected in the joint urgent appeal of the Working Group on Arbitrary Detention and the Special Rapporteur on Torture and other cruel, inhuman and degrading treatment or punishment, file no. UA G/SO 218/2G/SO 214 (53-24) MDA2/2012.

On the 13th of July 2011, according to the decision on the Central District Court of Chişinău, [REDACTED] (accused in the criminal case No. 2011968041 of committing offences provided by art. 145, para 2, let. g) and j) of the Criminal Code) was transferred to a Clinical Psychiatric Hospital adapted for the detention of persons arrested under the conditions of art. 490 of the Criminal Procedure Code.

On 23 August 2012 the Clinical Psychiatric Hospital has informed the prosecutor in the conditions of art. 490 of the Criminal Procedure Code that the psychiatric situation of [REDACTED] has improved.

According to the decision of the Central District Court of Chişinău of 22 December 2012, the request of the Clinical Psychiatric Hospital was admitted and, as a result, the hospitalization adapted for detention of the arrested person was terminated and he was released.

The Permanent Mission of the Republic of Moldova to the United Nations Office and other International Organizations in Geneva avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights, Special Procedure Branch, the assurances of its highest consideration.
