The following information has been provided by the "High Council for Human Rights of the Judiciary of the Islamic Republic of Iran":

Notwithstanding Mr. Omid Kokabi's conviction on charges of cooperation with hostile states and espionage, having met the due process of law; recently the court decided to apply the article 58 of the Islamic Penal Code (which states: Upon the proposal of the Public prosecutor or the judge in charge of execution of judgments, and subject to the conditions mentioned in this article, the deciding court can issue the order of conditional release for the convicted persons sentenced to more than ten years of imprisonment after half of the sentence is served), after receiving the consent of the prosecutor general, and consequently on 24 august 2016 decides that Mr. Kokabi could be conditionally released for 3 years and he was released.
