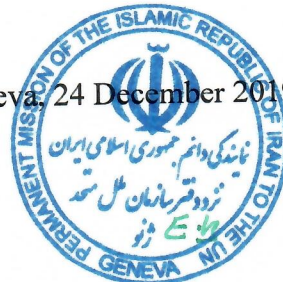

The response regarding the case of **Ms. Aras Amiri Larijani**, is as follows:

She has been sentenced to finalized 10 years of imprisonment, 2 years of social deprivation and a 2-year ban on exiting the country by the 1<sup>st</sup> Division of Sentence Enforcement of Tehran Prosecution Office.

She was apprehended on a temporary detention order on 9 September 2018, on charges of act against the national security and running a subversive network and transported to Evin Detention Center. Her sentence was finalized by Tehran Court upon completing all due legal formalities and receiving both her and her attorney's defense statements. It should be noted that she, like any other inmate, currently has access to prison services and facilities such as the possibility of making phone calls to her family and attorney and may enjoy all welfare and treatment services provided in prison.
