Dear Special Rapporteur,

First of all I must categorically reject the personal attack on Justice Zsolt Varga. The false allegations raised in your letter concerning his election as the President of the Kúria are unfounded.

The Hungarian judiciary is completely independent. Judges perform their duties impartially on the basis of facts and in accordance with the law.

The Hungarian Government does not have any information on the political preference of any judge. How can you have such information and what is the source of it? This is astonishing and raises serious concerns about your highly important role and capacity as Special Rapporteur.

I encourage You not to become a political tool of the Hungarian opposition.
