Regarding Messrs. Hossein Shabazi and Ali Arjangi

The comments regarding Messrs. **Hossein Shabazi and Ali Arjangi** enumerated hereunder are provided for further clarification:

Please be advised that a) Encouraging the concerned parties to arrive at a compromise because the enforcement of such verdicts depends upon the owners of the blood as each member of the victim's immediate next-of-kin possesses a discrete right of retribution, and b) Exhausting all efforts to convince the victim's next-of-kin to spare the convict through providing financial assistance to facilitate the commutation of capital punishment to blood money compensation, all constitute the principled policy of the Government of the Islamic Republic of Iran towards such convicts.

Furthermore, pursuant to a notification received from the Judiciary, the capital punishment verdict pronounced against Ali Arjangi is rendered null and void as the consent of the owners of the blood has been obtained.

Moreover, a stay of execution has also been granted for verdicts pronounced against Hossein Shahbazi; reconciliation efforts are underway to obtain the consent of the owners of blood.
