Information from the Russian Federation in response to the joint enquiry of the Human Rights Council special procedures concerning Oleg Baturin and Sergei Tsygipa (Ukraine)

The Russian Federation, having studied the joint enquiry, takes note of the information from the special procedures that Mr. Baturin is alive and confirms receipt of the notification from the Human Rights Council Working Group on Enforced or Involuntary Disappearances about the closure of his case (ref: G/SO 217/1/RUS of 20 July 2022).

Regarding the alleged abduction of Mr. Tsygipa, the Russian Federation has already considered and responded to the Working Group's enquiry (ref: G/SO 217/1 Russian Federation of 21 March 2022).
