Dear Special Rapporteurs,

First of all, thank You for the letter addressed to Minister Szijjártó concerning the alleged unlawful dismissal of Mr. Gáspár Békés.

I would like to recall that Mr. Békés was dismissed by the Budapest Municipal Authority, not by any government body, thus I encourage you to turn to the Mayor's Office for detailed information on the factual and legal grounds for the dismissal.

Nevertheless, I seize the opportunity to emphasize that Hungary is strongly committed to the protection and promotion of the freedom of thought, conscience, religion and expression. The Fundamental Law of Hungary fully guarantees these rights, including the freedom to choose or change one's religion or other belief, and the freedom of everyone to manifest, abstain from manifesting, practise or teach his or her religion or other belief through religious acts, rites or otherwise, either individually or jointly with others, either in public or in private life. In Hungary, laws are upheld and enforced by the State, as it has happened in the case of Mr. Békés as well. His legal claims were thoroughly investigated by the relevant authorities and the decisions were made in accordance with the relevant provisions of the applicable laws.

Dear Special Rapporteurs, allow me, finally, to draw your attention to the fact that today four-fifths of people persecuted for their religion and belief are Christians, who are also ethnic, national or linguistic minorities in the places where they live, hence facing maltreatment and open violence. Therefore, I hope that in the future you will also take similar actions in this area as well.

I avail myself of this opportunity to wish You good health and continued success in discharging your highly responsible duties.
