In response to the Joint Urgent Appeal from Special Procedures on April 14, 2025 with reference number UA IRN 3/2025 regarding Mr. Ruhollah Khosravi, the following is announced:

1. Mr. Ruhollah Khosravi was arrested on August 23, 2023 by a judicial order from Izeh Investigation Branch, while preserving the rights of citizens, on charges of buying and selling drugs, mischief, and disturbing public order and peace. He is well-known in the region for selling drugs and has numerous criminal convictions on charges of buying and selling drugs, disobeying officers, mischief, showing off with a hunting weapon, unauthorized shooting, and destroying property (with a private plaintiff), and disturbing public order. Therefore, his criminal actions have no connection to the so-called Movement of "Women, Life, Freedom". According to the documented report in the case file, some drugs were also discovered while arresting him.
2. He was immediately sent to Izeh Prosecutor's Office after his arrest and the charges were explained to him by the judicial authority, while preserving his legal rights and **without any pressure or torture**, at the Izeh Prosecutor's Office. In examining his statements before the judicial authorities, no claim was found from him that he was beaten, threatened or tortured by the officers, and this claim is completely fabricated. During the investigation, he met with the judge and prosecutor of Izeh several times and did not make any claims in this regard during these conversations. Therefore, the claim presented in this regard is not true.
3. Based on the investigations, **there's no order to keep the accused in solitary confinement and no report indicating this**. In addition, in none
