**Reply of Viet Nam to the Joint Communication concerning**  
**Mr. Tulku Hungkar Dorje (Viet Nam)**  
*Ref. AL VNM 4/2025 (dated 8 August 2025)*

The substance of the Joint Communication AL VNM 4/2025 is not accurate, and the allegations mentioned are untrue. Viet Nam rejects the false information surrounding this incident and respectfully provides the following clarification:

1. Waxi Longre (male, born on 15 August 1967, of Tibetan ethnicity, Chinese national, also known as Tulku Hungkar Dorje) lawfully entered and exited Viet Nam seven times through Noi Bai and Tan Son Nhat international border gates between 2017 and 2023. His most recent lawful entry into Viet Nam was on 8 October 2023, and he departed on 25 October 2023. Subsequently, in October 2024, he illegally entered Viet Nam and stayed with several women of different nationalities at an apartment in [REDACTED] Chi Minh City, without declaring his temporary residence. During this period, his living expenses were entirely covered by those individuals, and he did not leave the apartment or have contact with outsiders.

2. On 29 March 2025, [REDACTED], a Vietnamese citizen residing at Vinhomes Central Park, [REDACTED], Ho Chi Minh City, reported to the Police of Ward 22 (now Thanh My Tay Ward), Ho Chi Minh City, that Mr. Waxi Longre, a Chinese national living in the same apartment, had been found deceased. Upon receiving the report, the competent authorities of Ho Chi Minh City conducted verification and investigation. The results determined that Mr. Waxi Longre died of natural causes, with no signs of criminal activity.

3. A funeral ceremony for Mr. Waxi Longre was held on 19 April 2025 according to Tibetan Buddhist rites, attended by his relatives, representatives of religious organizations, officials from the Chinese diplomatic mission, and followers. The Vietnamese authorities facilitated assistance for his relatives and the Chinese Consular Office in transporting his ashes back to his homeland for burial on 20 April 2025./.
