The Permanent Mission of the Republic of Indonesia to the United Nations, the World Trade Organization, and other International Organizations in Geneva presents its compliments to the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights and has the honor to acknowledge receipt of Joint Communication No. AL IDN **4/2026** dated 30 March 2026.

The Permanent Mission wishes to inform the Office that the Government of the Republic of Indonesia **condemns** and **deeply regrets** the attack against the individual referred to in the above-mentioned Joint Communication. The President of the Republic of Indonesia has instructed that the matter be addressed in a serious, thorough, and transparent manner. The competent law enforcement authorities have initiated an investigation and have identified four suspects, members of the Indonesian National Armed Forces (TNI). The suspects have been arrested and are currently in detention pending trial before the competent court, in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.

As the case is under an active domestic legal process and being closely monitored by various civil society in Indonesia and the National Human Rights Commission, the Permanent Mission would urge the Special Rapporteur to fully respect the ongoing domestic legal process and to refrain from any actions that may prejudice or undermine the due process of law.

Furthermore, as there is currently a significant disparity between unverified public claims and the evolving factual findings of the investigation, the Permanent Mission considers it crucial for the Special Procedures to maintain a balanced and objective assessment. In this regard, the Permanent Mission further requests the Special Procedures to refrain from any publication or press release prior to completion of the investigation and the submission of the Government's official response, in order to prevent the dissemination of contested accounts and unverified claims at the multilateral level. The Permanent Mission would be grateful if the Office could transmit the aforementioned information to the relevant Special Procedures.

The Permanent Mission of the Republic of Indonesia to the United Nations, the World Trade Organization, and other International Organizations in Geneva avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights the assurances of its highest consideration.
